

SUBJECT: ALTERNATIVE LEARNING SYSTEM'S (ALS) START OF LEARNING INTERVENTION and IMPLEMENTATION OF PROGRAMS, PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

**DATE:** March 1, 2019

- 1. In eonsonance with the DepEd Memorandum No. 20 s. 2019 re: Announcement on the Schedule for the Start of Learning Intervention in the Alternative Learning System, the SDO Camarines Sur ALS, hereby advises the field to strictly adhere to the memorandum.
- 2. CID Chief, Division ALS Coordinator, Public Schools Districts Supervisors, and Education Program Specialists II, in ALS (EPSAs), are advised to monitor the conduct of the following activities prior to the start of learning session:
  - a. Literacy Mapping from February to May 2019; and
  - b. Training on the Utilization of ALS K to 12 Basic Education Curriculum and New ALS Assessment Forms, Informal Education Training, and Life Skills Training for ALS Teachers from March to May 2019.
- 3. The Division ALS Coordinator, PSDSs, EPSAs and districts implementers shall ensure the smooth implementation of ALS Programs, Projects and Activities (see enclosure 1, 2019 ALS Calendar of Activities and Learning Strand Assignment and see Enclosure 3.a 2019 district assignment and Special Program/Project and Enclosure 3.b EPSAs' Roles and Responsibilities)
- 4. All Master Teachers in ALS shall collaborate with their respective EPSA on the preparation of Daily Lesson Plan/Log and instructional materials for ALS (see Enclosure 4, Master Teachers' Learning Strand Assignment).
- 5. Data Management Training on April 8 to 12, 2019 and on April 22 to 26, 2019 (see enclosure 2 for the schedule) shall be conducted by the EPSA on their respective districts to ensure accuracy of data.

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- 6. The PSDSs shall ensure that their respective ALS Implementers have an accomplished reliable AF1 by Barangay; and district data on Learners No Longer in School, and transmitted to respective EPSA on or before May 25, 2019.
- 7. EPSAs shall have an authentic consolidated AF1 and No Longer in School on or before May 31, 2019.
- 8. Food and transportation expenses relative to the conduct of monitoring and supervision are chargeable against local fund subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 9. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
